The *California School Climate*, *Health*, *and Learning Survey (CalSCHLS) System* is comprised of three interrelated surveys developed for, and supported by, the California Department of Education:

- California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS)
- California School Staff Survey (CSSS)
- California School Parent Survey (CSPS)

Local Control and Accountability Plans. Data are provided for multiple LCAP state priorities, especially school climate, pupil engagement, and parent involvement. CHKS results can be disaggregated by all LCAP subgroup categories (see Tables 2 & 3).

Key Content

- Student, teacher, and parental engagement
- Academic mindset, expectations, and rigor
- School safety (social-emotional & physical), violence, and victimization (bullying)
- Discipline and order; clarity of rules and expectations
- Student connectedness to school (belonging) and learning motivation
- Positive interpersonal relationships among and between students, staff, and parents
- Opportunities for meaningful participation, decision-making, and engagement
- Substance use, depression/suicide risk, and other mental and physical health risks
- Student social-emotional health and competence
- Respect for diversity and equity
- School supports for students, staff, and parents
- Parental involvement
- Physical environment and resources of schools
- College and career readiness
